Oct Meeting Minutes – were approved as published in OVERDRIVE.

Several of the races were very close. He will tally the final vote in a few days and announce the results.

Death car ?? Just a few weeks after the fatal crash of James Dean in his Porsche 550 Spyder, all eyes were on this John Edgar owned 550 privateer at the Oct, 1955 6-hr endurance race at Torrey Pines, CA. It won its 1500cc class at this race and finished 4th overall just behind the Healey 100S driven by William Pringle and Roy Jackson-Moore. Pictured below is the start at the Torrey Pines meeting the following January. Driver Jack McAfee goes over the curb to out-maneuver a *Haggle of Healeys* and the rest of the hardcharging 50+ car field into the first turn. This first race-model design Porsche would go to record considerable success in sportscar racing throughout the world, and Torrey Pines would soon be transformed into a famous championship golf course !

When did you join the Central Indiana chapter of the Austin Healey Club of America? 1997

Were you in the US armed services? No.


Where did you attend High School? Bev – Franklin Central HS. Jim – Twin Lakes HS in Monticello.
