Attention Austin Healey Car Club Members:

AUCTION ITEMS NEEDED

At our September Roundup, the idea of the auction was to make money for the club AND Riley Hospital for Children. That has not changed. We have done very well in the past but the need for funding at Riley is great. Cancer research and treatment for children receives less funding than adult cancer research. It is because of this need, that I feel it is important to expand the auction to include more items. We will have a large audience of members from across the US and Canada with a variety of interests.

Previously we have had the traditional silent auction. This year it will be a "Chinese" auction where a member buys tickets and puts them in a variety of jars. He could put 1 ticket or all his tickets in a specific jar if he or she really wants the item. 1 ticket is drawn from the jar and that person's ticket "buys" that item. It has been found that this type of auction creates more money for the auction.

Traditionally, most of the items have been car items and we will continue to do that. But this year I would like to extend the auction to include baskets with a mixture of items for men, women and children. For example, a men's basket might be items from Auto Zone or O'Riley's. Last year we had a bucket of cleaning supplies donated from Auto Zone. There might be a basket of wine and cheese or a child's basket with for a girl or boy. We have a great many grandparents in the club. Many things you might already have around the house. You might consider them insignificant but when put with other items it creates a great basket. I often have extra gift cards someone has given me and haven't used. Maybe, you have an extra T-shirts from previous conclaves. Don't be afraid to ask a business for a donation.

I will need help, so if you'd like to be creative, please come and join me. Some items needed would be empty baskets, clear wrapping paper or shrink wrap paper or ribbons.

I would also like to have a "mini" auction for high priced items. Jim said there was an auctioneer who would be willing to help.
