I dropped off a club banner Bob tracked down that Doug wanted to decorate his garage at vintage races.



The Tire Squeal was hot again this year, with temps in the low 90s and high humidity. Michael Goldenburg had something come up and couldn't make the drive. I didn't get the Sprite together in time, and Roy had a hurt foot, so Jim and Bev in the Sprite was the only Healey in our group. After last year's LONG drive, we decided to split the drive into two parts, spending the night in French Lick (as Jim reported in his earlier president's message.) The road between Shoals and French Lick is out, so when we got to Shoals, I asked the trusty Garmin to find us an

alternate route. After a few miles the back road turned to gravel and continued for about 8 miles. I checked to make sure the Garmin was set to avoid unpaved roads. Apparently, my Garmin considers gravel to be pavement. In spite of going very slow, the dust made visibility very bad. After supper in French Lick, we drove to a quarter car wash to blast off the dust.

Jim and Bev were troopers traveling in the heat.

While Pat Bruce couldn't make the drive with us, he completed the route later bringing us to 4 club entries.

The Sprite finally got back on the road after the Tire Squeal. Big thanks to Bob for creating a drift to install the rear seal and advising me on the work. The 5th gear makes highway cruising great, but the clutch is going to take some getting used to.

On the 9th, we met for the drive to Singh Performance Autowerks. The weather called for only a 5% chance of showers for the day, but that 5% seemed to be following our route as we drove through sprinkles most of the day. Jim found a good route heading south, with lots of smooth roads. Ajmir showed us around the shop and gave a short presentation on his work and preferred oils and fuel additives. He also supplied the Burke's with a little petrol for assurance that they'd make it to a station. We then traveled to Oliver's Winery for snacks and some wine tasting.
