President's Message Apr 2022

With the passing of John Mann and Jim Frakes from Central Indiana AHC this year and Frank Wicker last year, there have been plenty of cars to hit the auction block. Whether person to person sales, on-line or through an established firm, the market seems to be very busy.

Bring-A-Trailer had a great 2021. Gross sales were \$828 million, more than double the 2020 total of \$398 million. Not bad for any business but exceptional for a company founded 7 years ago as an on-line auction. It is now the world's largest public platform for the sale of enthusiast's vehicles, per Hagerty.

Others are taking notice in the growth and demand in collector cars. Bonhams, the British auction firm started in 1793, is launching their digital service. They will soon be competing in the same realm as Mecums, Barret-Jackson and others.

But Bring-A-Trailer, although the largest, is not without its detractors, at least in the Healey world. (Is there any other world?) Read Chuck Anderson's comments in the February 2022 issue of the Healey Marque on page 26. His article laments not setting a reserve you want.

Same February issue, read Rick Neville's AUCTION REPORT. This has been an ongoing column for several years now. He talks about his experience in overseeing a sale of a Healey for a widow

of a club member. He listed the car on Bring-A-Trailer. His hints are to: set a reserve, be honest about the condition of the car and take lots of photos.

At our April 23rd meeting and drive our latest member Simon Marshall showed up. He is a former Healey owner who is now in the market for a car. We welcome him to our club and wish him the best in his search. Maybe when we assemble again on May 14th to drive to Burlington, IN and the café One More Cup, we might have a new car in our midst or at least a re-purposed car we have all seen before.

You know they don't make these Healeys anymore.
