Jim began the meeting asking for an update on Mad Dogs and Englishmen show in Michigan the weekend before. Melanie and Bob took their MGB, Pat Bruce and Steve/Brandon took Sprites. Pat went up Saturday in the bad weather to a run the rally, making his Saturday a LONG day. The show was very good. Gilmore's museum is a great place for the show. There were around 400 cars entered. Steve took third in the marquee Spridget class.

Jim got a call from someone looking for a radiator shop in Indy. They are getting hard to find. Jim recommended Paul's Radiator, but they are no longer in business. He asked about other shops. Fender Benders Body Shop was brought up (on 106th St).

The group agreed to make a \$200 donation to ACD Auburn Cord Duesenberg Museum in Roy's honor.

Jerry Butler (Jim Frake's nephew, who worked with Jim at the garage), called Jim Bush recently to let him know that the building where Frake's garage was has been sold, and there are some other items that he thought belonged to the club which needed to be taken out of the building. Jim went to pick up the items and met with Jerry. Jerry was seriously injured in an explosion/fire, but Jim said he looks to be on the mend. Jerry asked to be included in CIAHC emails so he knows what's going on with the club.

September Roundup Activities:

- 1. The Healey Marque finally has a listing of the event.
- 2. The auction bid sheets are done. We have lots of books from Roy/Jim Frakes. There are some valuable ones to auction. Some of the others will be grouped in bags for either the auction or a give-away (asking for donations).
- 3. We have official approval for the car show location at the courthouse. - 8. Jim B has 150 lanyards for the name tags.
- 9. The 'Health Certificates' for the weigh in are ready. Ruth (in her nursing gear) will assist Dr Jim (in scrubs) with the physicals as part of the rally.
- 10.Bonnie showed the 'I drove mine' pins. The group decided that the pins would be for those that drove their cars to the event.
- 11.Jim Switzer sent Steve a list of about 600 Austin Healey club members around the Midwest. Miscellaneous Meanderings

There are a LOT of club members who still haven't registered for September Roundup! Get your entries sent in quickly! August 1st the fee goes up.

Get registered for the IBCU British Motor Day in Zionsville on the 12th! We need the Healeys out there!

Brandon and I want to thank Bob Haskell and Pat Bruce for their help getting his Sprite put together! Pat dropped off a heater box to use (which he de-rusted using black magic). Bob has bailed us out twice (so far) with machine work and fixes.

I wish more of you could have made our drive to Michigan for the Mad Dogs and Englishmen car show. Bob and Melanie in their MGB followed Brandon and I in the Sprite up to Kalamazoo Saturday for an overnight stay before heading to the show Sunday morning. Our iron man Pat Bruce got up EARLY on Saturday to also drive in the Saturday afternoon rally. We had planned on leaving around 9:30 for the drive but after looking at the heavy rains headed our way decided to wait until after 11 to depart. It was a good move for us, as we just encountered a few brief showers on the drive with comfortable temperatures and nice roads. Only one missed turn on the way up. Our directions showed us turning on WXY road, and we passed XY road, not knowing that was XY West road.

Pat, on the other hand drove through the storms, arrived just in time for the rally to start, and didn't get to his hotel until around 6 that evening. It was a great show (but could have used some more big Healeys). There were two amazing MK2 Sprites that Brandon examined closely.

The Haskells opted to spend Sunday in Michigan and come back Monday. Pat followed us on the return drive home. We took an alternate route home which was supposedly quicker, but the roads weren't as smooth. We encountered one detour, which slowed us getting out of Michigan. I'm used to having a 5th gear and was cruising at a comfortable pace. That pace had Pat pushing his 4-speed, and sucking more fuel. We both arrived home before 9:30 after a nice trip.

Trying to get Brandon's Sprite Ready for Zionsville. How hard can a clutch installation be on a 948? I've done at least a dozen clutch changes over the years, and just did one with the trans

change in the Bugeye recently. This was a chance to show Brandon how it's done. 6 bolts on the pressure plate, lining up the clutch plate, piece of cake.

After pulling the engine, we found the old clutch was destroyed – pressure plate spring broke, throw out bearing worn at an angle, clutch plate down to the rivets, slave cylinder shot. Ordered a new clutch kit and slave, took the flywheel to be turned - eta on the flywheel 2 days. After almost a week, I called the machine shop. It had been ready for several days, but their computer and phone system had crashed, so they couldn't get in contact with anyone.

Clutch kit arrived. The pressure plate looked like something was wrong, as one of the fingers holding the contact surface for the throw out bearing was tilted. Called the parts supplier. The tech was familiar with the old 948 clutches. He said these were a bad design, and they were frequently like that - but they work. We could either bounce on the springs a few times to settle them, or just put it in and the first few times pressing the clutch pedal would align the springs.

After some work getting some of the 60+ years of gunk off and repainting the engine from a terrible blue color, we were ready to put the flywheel back on. 4 bolts and two locktabs, piece of cake. Torqued the first bolt, and the locktab twisted up – shouldn't have tried to reuse them. Order new locktabs. When they come in, we got the same result! Got on the forums and ask what's going on. Find out the engine builders aren't using them, just grade 8 washers and locktite. Flywheel finally was back on!



Put clutch disk and pressure plate back in position. The pressure plate was a little snug on the alignment pins – but thought it should pull down fine. WRONG. Set the torque wrench to 16 ft lbs and begin bolting on the pressure plate. First bolt tightened just fine, and the pressure plate pulled down easily over the alignment pin. Second bolt turned for a moment, then the bolt snaped in 2. After a session of bad language, took the pressure plate back off. Not enough of the bolt extended out of the flywheel to remove it, and the other alignment pin is now stuck in the pressure plate instead of the flywheel.

First call to Bob for help! Pulled the flywheel and took it over to his shop, where he was able to machine down the broken bolt so he could center drill it and get an easy-out to remove the broken bolt. He also opened up the pin holes in the pressure plate so they properly fit over the pins, and provided new bolts. Clutch and pressure plate were finally in place!

Work was then delayed 4 days due to loosing power at the house following a storm.

Power back on, ready to proceed. The plan was to take off the old slave cylinder and quickly put the new one on so we lose very little fluid. Wrong – the old slave cylinder fitting had been over tightened so the fitting couldn't be re-used. All of the fluid drained out of the master line and the master cylinder. At one time years ago, I had a cheap flaring tool to replace fittings, but it's long disappeared, and I couldn't find a new fitting. Second call to Bob. He has a flaring tool, but it's one that can be easily borrowed. So, we had to remove the pipe from the master cylinder to the slave cylinder. It snakes around wires, hoses, cables that had to be disconnected to get it out, then we headed back to Bob's garage. Bob got a new fitting on the line and we headed home again.

After lots of other issues, the engine and trans were back in, ready to add fluid so we can test if this whole endeavor was successful. I thought I'd show Brandon how fun it is to fill the transmission when the fill plug is somewhat inaccessible. He reported that he couldn't get the fill plug out. After two of us working on it, loosing one socket into the transmission tunnel (got to remember to get that out), and not breaking it loose with over 100 pounds of torque, it was back to the forum for help. Looks like we're going to refill the trans via the shifter. Just have to carefully measure the fluid going in so we don't overfill.

It's been two months now. Two weeks to go for Zionsville. Wish us luck.

Bring a Trailer has a Sprite Mk IV that's been converted to electric. Not a practical conversion, as it doesn't get many miles on a charge. Doesn't seem to be very well received, as the bid is less than \$700 with two days left. The remaining original pieces are worth more than that.
