The drive put on by the Jaguar club pulled in 13 cars: 2 F Type Jags, 2 E Types, and my Sprite. The MG crowd came out in an alphabetic force; an MGC, a 1945 MG TC Midget, 3 MG TDS, and an MG TF. I felt like a wimp. Most of the cars had the hoods down for the drive while I had mine up with the side curtains in.

We were using a route the Porsche club had run just a couple weeks early, and the route was well laid out. The route took us through the big cities of Hadley and before arriving for lunch at Sahm's Haven on Heritage Lake. We then headed for Park County and the covered bridges.

Three covered bridges later, we arrived at Billie Creek Village. I've been by the village several times but have never stopped to explore it. It's a village of 38 historic structures, built from 1830 to 1913. All of the structures were relocated to the present location. Several of the buildings are said to be haunted and are visited nightly by 'paranormal investigators'.

Leaving Billie Creek, we started our last leg heading to Bridgeton. After a total of 6 covered bridges, we stopped at the Bridgeton Mill which is the oldest working grain mill west of the Alleghenies where several purchases were made of various ground meals for cooking and some fresh pumpkin and chocolate cookies. The mill is for sale if you are looking for a new business opportunity. The Bridgeton covered bridge is next to the mill, bringing our total to 7 for the day.

We'd planned on heading back to Danville for a meal at the Mayberry Diner, but folks had to head home so we took off in different directions. 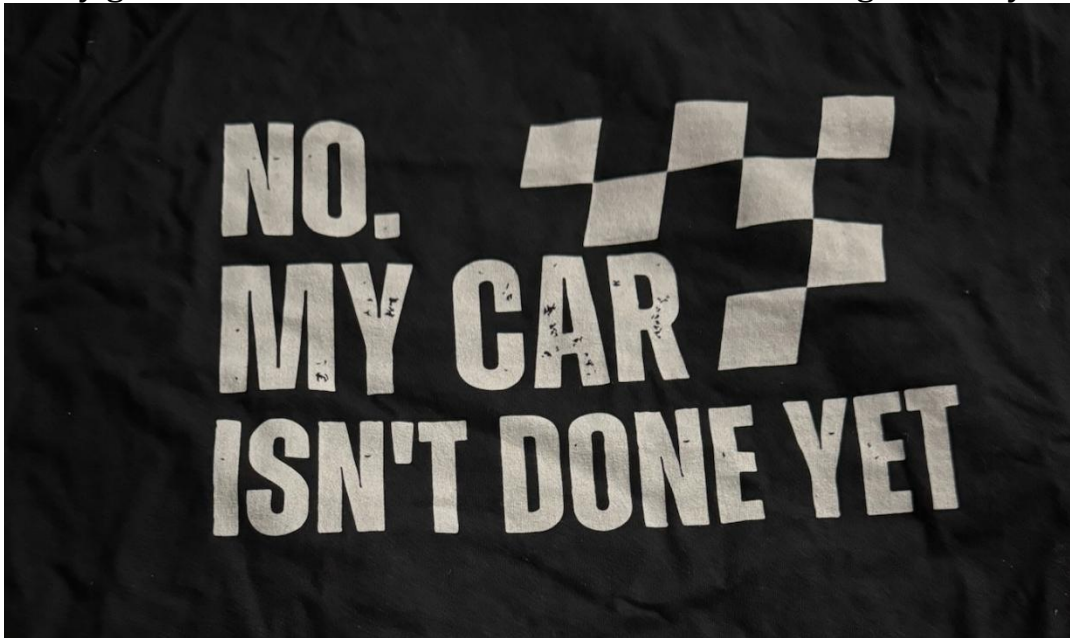
We've started re-wiring Brandon's Sprite, beginning with the easiest rear section. In September he had smoke coming out of the boot but we couldn't find the source. Pulling the old wiring, the issue was apparent! The power wire for the license light had the

grommet rotted away and the wire was grounding against the housing, burning the wiring down to the loom at the bottom of the boot. The wire ran behind the brace for the boot latch, hiding the damage. The reason there wasn't an actual fire was that the shorted wire burned apart, stopping the short.

Connecting the new harness to the existing wiring behind the dash we gave the rear lights a try. Oops. Brandon was able to track down my error and got the lights working correctly. He makes sure I have my glasses on when doing wiring now.

The dash is out, and Jerry Baker did a masterful job of filling in the holes for the radio and the jury-rigged horn button (of course). While we put the rest of the harness in, Brandon has new bezels for the gauges, new switches, and vinyl to clean up the dash.

Kathy got Brandon a t-shirt for Christmas that is fitting for many of us.
